- 1 Campbells, do you recall any other personal encounters
- 2 in the fall of 2011?
- 3 A No. I don't recollect talking to them any
- 4 other time in that time period.
- 5 Q In encounter number two where they came in
- 6 with some witnesses or supporters, when you asked them
- 7 to leave, did they leave?
- 8 A No. They refused to leave.
- 9 Q And what did you do in response to their not
- 10 leaving?
- 11 A I informed them that if they did not leave,
- 12 I was going to call the Sheriff's Department. They
- 13 refused to leave. So I instructed Crystal to phone the
- 14 Sheriff's Department.
- 15 Q And was the Sheriff's Department actually
- 16 telephoned?
- 17 A Yes.
- 18 Q Did a sheriff's deputy actually show up?
- 19 A Yes.
- Q Was that before or after the Campbells left?
- 21 A The Campbells went out of the office and
- 22 waited for the deputy in the parking lot.
- 23 Q And do you know whether they had a
- 24 conversation with the deputy?
- 25 A Yes.

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- 2 yours that was attested to on February 9, 2012?
- 3 A It is.
- 4 Q There's been a series of questions that have
- 5 come out today partly because of the indentures, which
- 6 were alleged to have been filed in May of 2011. It says
- 7 that: Whereas National Development Company, Inc., a
- 8 Texas corporation, is the owner of certain real property
- 9 located in Washington County.
- 10 Can you tell us what your understanding
- 11 of the relationship between National Development
- 12 Company and Woodland Lakes Trusteeship is?
- 13 A Yes. National Development Company was the
- 14 developer of Woodland Lakes. They started the
- 15 development in 1980, and in April of 19 -- and they were
- 16 the original trustee, thus, that's why they're mentioned
- 17 in there. On April of 1985 the current trustee, who was
- 18 an officer of National Development, turned the
- 19 Association over to the property owners.
- 20 Q And when you say the property owners, are
- 21 you talking about Woodland Lakes Trusteeship?
- 22 A We did not become the Trusteeship until
- 23 later on when we filed -- incorporated, but the
- 24 Association was turned over to the property owners in
- 25 April of 1985.

- 1 Q And according to this affidavit you
- 2 completed Paragraph 10 says: National Development has
- 3 had no involvement with Woodland Lakes since 1996. What
- 4 was -- that ensuing ten years what was their
- 5 involvement?
- 6 A Between 1985 and 1996 we cohabited.
- 7 National Development was still the developer who still
- 8 sold lots. They were still developing the development.
- 9 We were the Homeowner's Association and collected the
- 10 assessment fees, and maintained those areas that were
- 11 completed that National -- after a certain period of
- 12 time National would turn those common ground areas over
- 13 to us and we would maintain them. In 1996 they left.
- Q And so if I understand what you're saying,
- 15 in 1996 National Development had no involvement

- 25 A The result of that lawsuit was in 1985 when

- 1 Q The Trusteeship does not buy or sell lots 2 within the -- .
- A -- No, sir, they do not.
- 4 Q And the Trusteeship was assigned the rights
- of National Development to enforce the restrictions; is
- 6 that correct?
- 7 A Yes, sir.
